A new hotel and a fresh twist on South Asian fare – what more can one ask for? A big ticket franchise for the hotel, Republic of Noodles' first outlet in Soa has been a big hit and the brand Itself has won the prestigious Times Food Award.

THE AMBIENCE:

The restaurant's eye-catching wall display outlining the map of South East Asia along with memorabilia from the region's different countries including passport covers and postal stamps make for great conversation pieces. Its location in an alfresco area overlooking the pooliside also gives it a unique and unconvential feel.



Going beyond noodles and serving cuisines from Thailand, Singapore, Vietnam, Indonesia, Cambodia, Myammar, Malaysia and even Ball and Java – this republic is quite democratic and sources its exocit ingredients from local suppliers across these countries. To maintain standards, cheb from each oudet are trained together and form menus only after several tasting sessions.

Speaking of the menu, it's a fine blend of interesting flavours and textures. Besides the usual starters, soups, rice, noodles, curries and desserts, Republic Of Noodles serves signature hot sauces to add an extra punch.



Must try's include Indonesian Barnee Goreng with Vegetables and Kecap Manis, Bangkok Style Phad Thal Noodles with Wol Seared Prawns, Bamboo Shoots with Picked Chilli, Jungle Curry of Chicken, Vegetables and Green Peppercorn, Pineapple Curry with Prawn and Lychee, and Yellow Curry Fish with Coconut and Tamarini.

From savoury to sweet, desserts are given their due with Water Chestnut Rubies and Longan in Coconut Milk, Sweet Red Azuki Bean Pancakes and ice cream in flavours like Tamarind, Wasabi, Green Tea, Kaffir Lime, Lemongrass and Orange.
